Scholarships for Boys Entering Years 12-13, 2012

Years 12-13 Realising Potential – Student in Need Scholarships

These scholarships are awarded to students currently at the College and entering at Years 12 or 13. Selected students will be required to attend an interview with the Headmaster in Term 4. All candidates will be informed of the decision regarding the Scholarship.

The value of the scholarships is a proportion of the tuition fee for one to two years (depending on year entry level), with no candidate receiving less than one-third fees. The tenure of the scholarship is closely monitored, with a full review at the end of each academic year. Should a boy not be committing himself properly to his studies, the scholarship could be withdrawn.

The application form must be accompanied by a covering letter outlining the reasons for application.

Conditions and Regulations of Scholarships

1. The fee for the Scholarship application is \$25.00 (GST incl.) per candidate and is to be made payable to Scots College and **attached to the application**. The fee covers administrative costs.
2. The Realising Potential Scholarships are tenable for a period of one to two years (depending on year entry level) and are reviewed each year by the Headmaster subject to satisfactory performance. In the case of an unsatisfactory report the Scholarship could be terminated.
3. The Board reserves the right not to award any or all of the Scholarships offered if the candidates do not reach the required standard.
4. Scots College is a Presbyterian Church School and a successful candidate is expected to participate fully and willingly in the Christian aspect of its curriculum.
