OBJECTS (HEADMASTER APPROVED)

- The objects of the Club are:
 - To promote, encourage, foster and develop the playing of Football at Scots College.
 - To promote and develop the necessary skills of the game and a sense of sportsmanship and fair play.
 - Subject to domestic law variations adopted by New Zealand Football and or Competition Rules by Capital Football or College Sport, comply with the Laws of the Game and regulations specified by FIFA, that the New Zealand Football considers to be in the best interests of football in New Zealand.
 - To encourage participation in, and support for, Football by all participants in, and supporters of, the game and at all levels (including by way of example, administrators, players, coaches, referees, match officials and supporters).
 - To advise and promote to College management the facilities, infrastructure and development needs which facilitates supporters of the game participation in Football at Scots College.
 - Do all such other things to promote the interests of Football as Scots College may advise the Club by written notice signed by the Chairperson at that time of the Board of Governors of Scots College.

OBJECTS – THE HOW A-E

POWERS OF THE CLUB

(A) After obtaining College permission secure monies or undertake fund raising initiatives by any or all of the following;

- Charging a membership subscription;
- Grant rights to sponsors, promoters or fund raisers;
- Applying for community grant money or the like;
- Charging fees for any tournaments promoted or arranged;
- Charging fees for any Club organized or arranged social events, functions or the like;
- Charging any Scots College students account for any Club expense such as for example any tournament, transport, coaching, development squad or the like expense where prior written parental approval is provided;
- By any other means with the approval of the Headmaster and or the Board as the circumstance may require.

OBJECTS – THE HOW B & C

- (B) Print and publish any information by any media including newsletters, newspapers, articles or leaflets for promotion of the Club provided that all times the Club adheres to College Communication Policies.
- (C) Provide gifts and prizes in accordance with the objects of the Club.

OBJECTS – THE HOW D & E

(D) Develop a short, medium and long term Club Development Plan to give effect to the Objects of the Club including but not limited to;

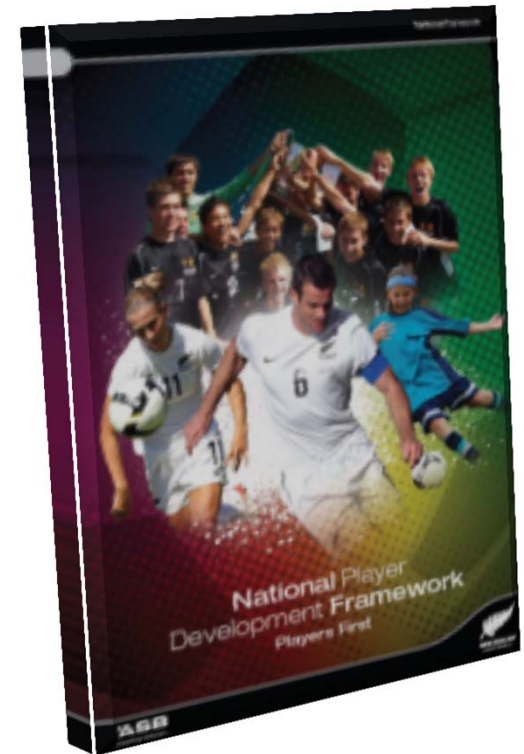
- Participation in Futusal for all members who wish to play;
- Participation in all College Sport and or Capital Football Leagues for all members who wish to play;
- Participation in any tournaments such as Summer 5 for all members who wish to play;
- Closer coordination with local community Football clubs such as Miramar Rangers to leverage shared coaching, training and courses or the like;
- Active Scots College staff participation in either a Manager or Coach role for each Club team;
- Active parent, senior pupil, old boy and supporter participation in Coaching or Manager roles;
- Retention of Coaches including succession planning for a tailored coaching solution for a matrix structure for each year for those that wish to play social and those that wish to compete at the highest levels;

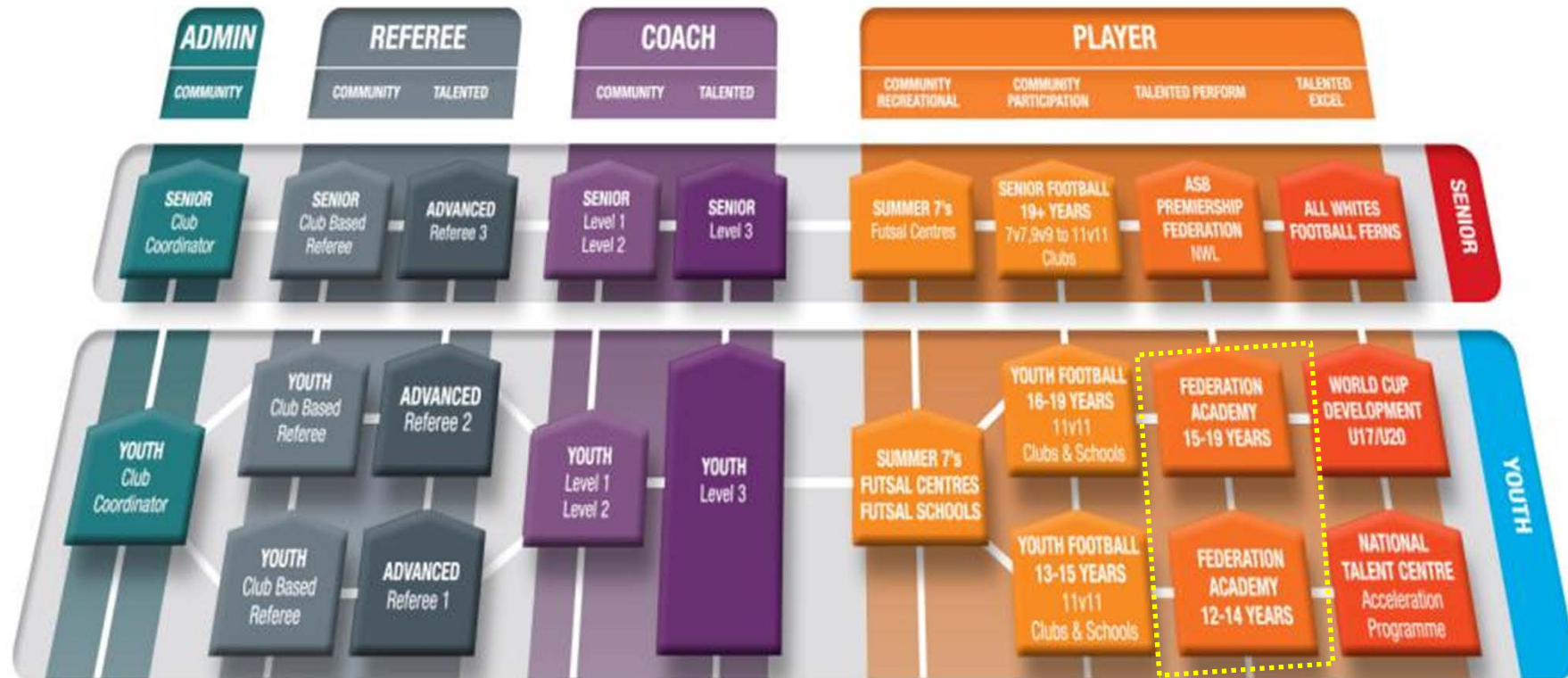
(E) The organisation of social events for members and the promotion of the Club.

- Maybe in conjunction with MR.



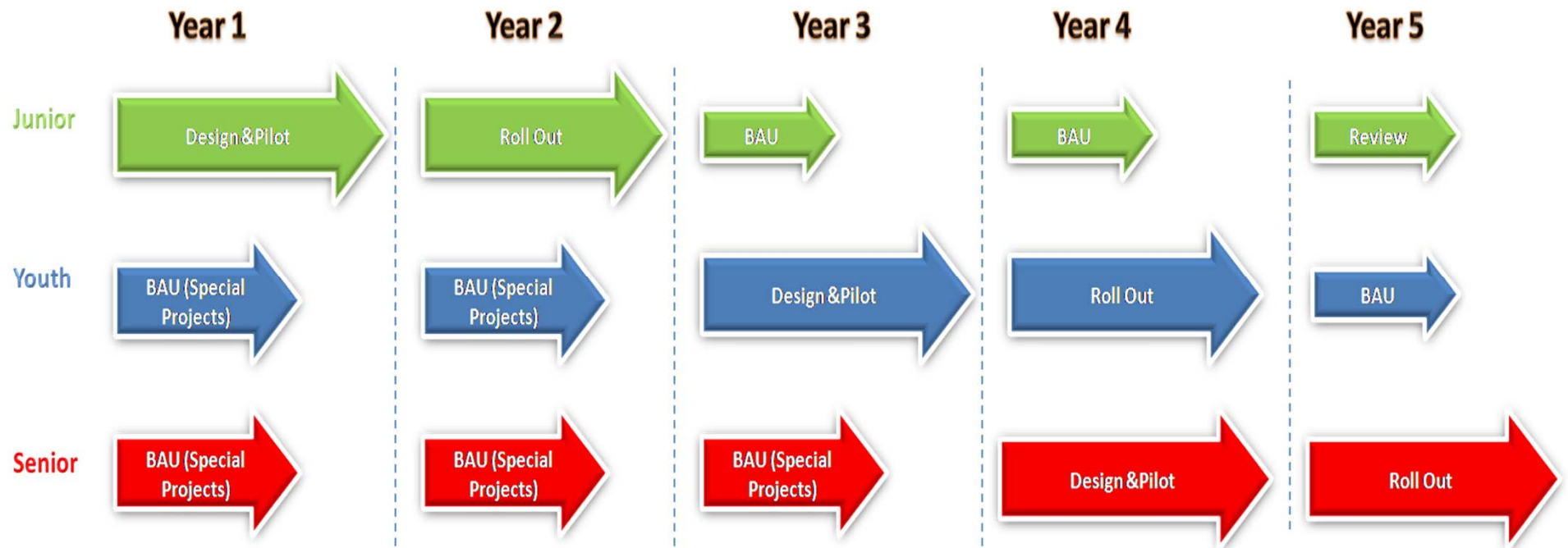
Stage 2 & 3 - Primed for Action

- Traditional fixtures.
- Middle School years 9 & 10 fixtures.
- Works well in Prep School and Senior College.
